You should be sure to include, as well, a clear statement as to how this award would make possible a project that would otherwise not be possible without financial support.
- Unofficial UMD transcript.
- Resume or list of activities and previous awards.

Please note that, if your application is successful, you will need to meet with Theresa Morse (tmorse@umd.edu), Director of Finance and Administration in our Department, to plan your travel (if relevant), expenses, and reimbursement. Within a month of the end of your project, you will be expected to write a brief (two-page, double-spaced) report of your experience (illustrations are welcome!)
